

Dear Social Security Officer,

The American Journey Cultural Exchange (AJ1) issues this letter in order to confirm and clarify the status of participant in our J1 Exchange Visitor Programs, administered under the auspices of the U.S. State Department's Exchange Visitor Program.

Participants are admitted under Section 101 (A) (15) (J) of the Immigration and Nationality Act and is eligible to work in the U.S. according to the terms of this program. The J-1 visa status of this exchange visitor is evidenced by the DS-2019 form, which specifies AJ1 as the legal sponsor, as well as by the U.S Entry stamp in his/her passport. These items serve as confirmation of the participant's eligibility for employment under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 (IRCA) and of his/her lawful admission into the U.S.

In order for this visitor to work in the U.S., s/he will need to apply for a Social Security number. In order to do so, the AJ1-sponsored participant will present the following documents:

- Valid passport, with J-1 visa and U.S. entry stamp (please note this stamp replaces the paper I-94).
- Form DS-2019 Certificate of Eligibility for Exchange Visitor Status

In addition to the documents mentioned above, this letter also serves as this participant's sponsor letter, authorizing employment during the authorized dates as stated on the DS-2019 form.
